Q: What office/s do you currently hold? What office/s have you held in the past?

Q: What is your proudest accomplishment while serving in an elected office? and/or What is your current priority during this term of office?

Through the connections and relationships I have had, I was able to learn, grow, and develop and use those what I gained to help better my community. I secured four (4) companies to work with and supply jobs in the community through a workforce program, as well as had two (2) housing buildings built. I also was able to build a community partnership with Whirlpool and Cornerstone.
